Poppy Day

Christmas has gone and is now a distant memory — only 9 months until the next one! The first few months of any year here are busy with Sally and I both collecting and documenting memberships, preparing for the Dunedin RSA AGM, gearing up for Poppy day collection on Friday 17th April, Posy making on the 24th April and of course Anzac Day on the 25th April which promises to be huge this year due mainly to worldwide

recognition and commemoration of the 100 years since those fateful landings at Gallipoli.

Times change, attitudes change and people come and go, but I

believe that RSA, and especially the work I do is just as relevant today as it was back in 1915 when events at Gallipoli

sowed the seeds for the establishment of what is now the RSA.

New Zealand's first Poppy Day was the 24th April 1922, the day before Anzac Day. The plan was to hold it in November 1921, closer to Armistice Day, however the ship carrying poppies from France was delayed and it was decided to postpone the day until the following Anzac Day. Nationally, on that first day, almost 250,000 poppies were sold for a shilling each. Last year the Dunedin collection raised around \$62,000 from 40,000 poppies.

From those early days the Poppy Day Appeal was the primary means of raising funds for the welfare of returned service personnel and their dependants. Recognising the diverse nature of the modern NZDF and it's cohorts in the 21st century,

various remits have been passed at RNZRSA National Council meetings which broaden the group of people entitled to be eligible to receive assistance from poppy day funds. That group now includes: All returned, serving and ex-service and NZ Police personnel, their spouses, partners, widows, widowers and dependants who are in need. You will note that this doesn't require beneficiaries to be members of an RSA, or 'returned'. In my view this is a positive move by RNZRSA and will help to make all RSAs and their individual Poppy Trusts more inclusive. I am also quite proud of the fact that the Dunedin RSA Welfare Trust is a pro-active and progressive group which has always taken a pragmatic view when addressing the welfare of the larger 'service family'.

Running commemorative events has always relied heavily on volunteers. There are many dawn services throughout the country which all require coordination and organising. It is a time when RSA volunteers can be stretched so if we are to cement this 2015 Anzac Day in history and make it something really special I'd ask that you all consider donating a little of

your time, whether it is collecting for Poppy Day on the 17th, or Posy Making on the 24th April, and of course please join an Anzac commemorative service wherever you are – *lest we forget*.
