



The branch was established in Dunedin by a group of volunteers following the first establishment of the NZRA in Porirua.

The aims of the organisation are to locate the burial sites of servicemen and women whose headstones have been neglected or damaged and record the histories of those people. They will then follow up with repairing the damaged headstones. To date they are in the process of identifying the burial sites, the campaigns and units that the deceased took part in. The branch has formed a trust and established protocols with the DCC. They also have to provide all the materials in the cleaning of the headstones.

End of year thoughts from your Support Advisor.

This time of year is traditionally when thoughts turn to Christmas festivities, end of year functions, holidays, family and friends. It can also be a stressful time and people can find themselves; alone as their mates enjoy their own families, under extra financial pressure, swamped by visitors or just upset through having their routines disrupted.

In the RSA Support Services space, this is a time when we need be extra vigilant to the needs of our greater service family. Those of you who are RSA members will, I am sure, know other service or ex-service families who aren't members. Not all service or ex-service people belong to an RSA, yet they live among us in our communities. Many surviving spouses or dependants aren't members either, but they are just as entitled to our care and support as those who are.

Much of the work I do involves being pro-active and extending awareness and care to those in our community who are in need. I think that seeking opportunities to offer support is a far better way to do business than waiting to respond to cries for help, though crisis response is important too. As true today as when Joseph Malins wrote them in 1895 are the words from his poem 'A Fence or an Ambulance':

Better guide well the young than reclaim them when old,

For the voice of true wisdom is calling:

"To rescue the fallen is good, but 'tis best

To prevent other people from falling."

Better close up the source of temptation and crime

RNZRSA News 79th year RSA sends taste of Kiwi Christmas to troops overseas



It was more than 30 Christmases ago, but BJ Clark still vividly remembers being far from home and family, opening the treat-laden Royal New Zealand Returned and Services' Association gift parcel.

The now-National President of the RSA, who took a New Zealand Army team down to Antarctica in 1986 to undertake a major construction project, says he quickly homed in on one particular delicacy: a can of hearty tuatua soup.

"That soup was delicious, warm and, it didn't last very long at all in that temperature. Having said that, we didn't let a white Christmas stop us rugging up and tucking into a few Kiwi barbecues."

Mr Clark joined the RNZRSA Board, Chief Executive Karen Rolleston and staff for one of the most important days on the organisation's calendar – packing gift parcels for the New Zealand Defence Force personnel serving overseas this Christmas.



And, the RSA team weren't short on helpers. Defence Minister Ron Mark, Chief of Defence Force Air Marshal Kevin Short, NZDF staff, returned servicepeople and school children were among those rolling up their sleeves to

pack more than 300 parcels.

Ms Rolleston says RNZRSA staff love being involved in a tradition that started 79 years ago.

"We're very grateful to Headquarters Joint Forces NZ which does a phenomenal job helping with organisation, and also ensuring the packages are delivered everywhere from the Israel-Lebanon border region and the Sinai Peninsula, the North and South Korea border, Afghanistan and Iraq to Antarctica.

"It's so important for us that everyone who receives a Christmas parcel feels with it the immense gratitude, care and support from not just all of us in the RSA movement, but the many others who make this happen."
